DR. BERNICE PRINSLOO



Dr. Prinsloo completed her medical training in South Africa, where she worked in obstetrics and psychiatry before moving to Ireland in 2008 to complete training in child and adolescent psychiatry. She worked in community children's mental health and youth addiction services in Ireland before moving to Canada, where she worked in community children's mental health clinics in Edmonton, Alberta from 2017. In 2019 she joined ElmTree Clinic, a mental health clinic in Edmonton for infants and preschool children and their families. Dr. Prinsloo is an Assistant Clinical Professor in Psychiatry at the University of Alberta.

DR. SOPHIE FLOR-HENRY



Dr. Flor-Henry was born and raised in Edmonton. She completed medical school at the University of Calgary, psychiatry residency at the University of Toronto, and returned to the University of Alberta for subspecialty training in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Upon graduating, she moved to the Yukon where she now lives and works, and also remains connected to the University of Alberta Child Adolescent Psychiatry program as the Rural Rotation Coordinator.

DR. POLINA ANANG



Dr. Anang is assistant professor of psychiatry at the University of Manitoba's Rady Faculty of Health Sciences, a child and adolescent psychiatrist, and a fellow of Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. She enjoys close collaboration with pediatric interdisciplinary teams providing care for youth with chronic illness as well as youth with somatic symptom and conversion disorders. She is committed to exploring intersexuality, ethics, and power structures. Her research informs her clinical work in Child and Adolescent psychiatry and her role as advocate of dismantling systemic racism in health care.

DR. MATTHEW MORRISSETTE



Dr. Morrisette is an early-career child and adolescent psychiatrist who completed his training at the University of Manitoba. He is the Zone Clinical Department Facility Chief for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at the Stollery Children's Hospital in Edmonton and an assistant clinical professor in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Alberta, where he is actively involved in the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Subspecialty Residency Program. His clinical work focuses on pediatric emergency psychiatry and the treatment of mood and anxiety disorders, including rTMS. His research interests include medical education issues.

DR. CÉCILE ROUSSEAU



Dr. Rousseau is professor at McGill University Division of Social and Cultural Psychiatry and holds a Canada Research Chair in the prevention of violent radicalization. She has worked extensively with immigrant and refugee communities, developing specific school based interventions and leading policy oriented research. Presently her research focuses on intervention and prevention programs to address social polarization and violent radicalization.
