

PRITE Data Sharing Policy

As of: 9/2020

PRITE Programs will be notified each year in writing that PRITE data, devoid of any personal or identifying information specific to Programs or to residents, may be shared and/or used for research and publication purposes with written permission of The College.

PRITE data may be used internally within a Program without explicit permission for educational and performance assessment and improvement purposes.

All PRITE data usage proposals should be submitted in writing to: Kathryn Delk – kathryn@acpsych.org
The proposal should include a clear description of the goals, methods (including specific use of the data requested) and purpose of the project, including dissemination goals (e.g. article submission to a specific journal). It should also clearly state that the project initiator would be willing to co-author with a member of the PRITE Editorial Board of The American College of Psychiatrists.

When requests are received for the use of PRITE data for purposes other than for internal program educational/performance use, the proposal will be assessed by a sub-group of the PRITE Commission composed of the: PRITE Commission Chair , PRITE Editor-in-Chief, PRITE Associate Editor, CHILD PRITE Associate Editor and Assistant Executive Director or their designees, as appropriate.

The proposal will be reviewed and assessed for appropriate use of PRITE data and educational value to the field as well as the ability for a PRITE Editorial Board Member to co-author the project.

The sub-group of the PRITE Commission will respond within ten business days of receiving the request/proposal.

If permission is granted, the PRITE Commission must be given an opportunity to review the project before it is submitted for publication. The PRITE Commission will also be given the right to include a response/rebuttal of the information posed, to be included as part of publication, as it pertains to PRITE data/information.
